

## How to Make Pumpkins from Toilet Paper Rolls

This project is SO easy and SO inexpensive. (Don't worry - no sewing is required.) If you can cut and tuck, you can totally do this.

This is a fun Fall Decor project that takes about 5 minutes!



## Here is what you will need:

Roll of Toilet Paper (one roll per pumpkin)

Fabric (about 1/4 yard)

Plastic Bags (2-4)

Scissors

Stick



Step 1:

Place the fabric print side down.



You can use cotton batting or plastic bags to make the pumpkin plumper.

Step 2:

Place one bag on top of the fabric and then place roll of tissue on top of the plastic bag. Start tucking the plastic bag into the roll. The more bags you use the fuller your pumpkin will be.

Flip the roll of tissue over and poke a hole on the opposite side. (You are going to need to tuck in your bags on this side too.)





Start tucking the fabric into one side of the toilet paper roll.



You should now have a full pumpkin looking shape



Step 4:

Tuck a stick into the toilet paper roll to make the stem of the pumpkin.



You can choose any fabric you like. Be sure to check the scrap fabric at your local craft score since you only need about 1/4 per pumpkin! You can make this craft for pennies. At the end of the Fall Season, just unwrap the rolls and save the fabric and sticks for next season.



You can also make a Halloween version.
